

HOW TO LOVE LIKE JESUS

STUDY GUIDE

Hebrews 12:2, Romans 8:28, 2 Timothy 3:16

Observation questions

1. In Hebrews 12:2, what two roles does Jesus have in our faith?
2. What does Romans 8:28 say God does with “all things”?
3. In Genesis 1, what does God do before the sun, moon, and stars are created?
4. What phrase did Jesus repeatedly use when responding to the enemy in the wilderness?

Interpretation questions

1. What does it mean that Jesus is both the “author” and “finisher” of our faith? How should that shape the way we view our life?
2. The sermon emphasized that “the book is better.” What is the difference between living based on what we see (scenes) versus what God has said (the Word)?
3. Why is relying on “signs” or “confirmation” sometimes a sign of weak faith rather than strong faith?
4. The message explains that God can bring order out of chaos. What does this reveal about God’s character?
5. How does understanding your life as a “written story” change the way you respond to difficult seasons?

THE BOOK IS BETTER

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Application questions

1. What is one area of your life where you've been reacting to the "scene" instead of trusting what God's Word says?
2. Is there a part of your past that you struggle to believe God can redeem? What would it look like to fully surrender that to Him?
3. Where in your present life do you need God to bring order out of chaos? How can you invite Him into that situation this week?
4. Are you currently waiting for a "sign" from God about something He has already spoken in His Word? What step of obedience can you take now?
5. Is there an area of your life (family, finances, identity, calling) that you need to allow God to reclaim? What step of obedience can you take?
6. Think about your future—where do you feel unqualified or stuck? How does this message challenge that mindset?
