Joshua 2:1, 8-12, Hebrews 11:31, Judges 4-5, 1 Peter 2:9

Observation questions

1. What specific actions did Rahab take to protect the spies, and what motivated her to do so?
2. How does the sermon describe the relationship between hearing stories of God's power and developing faith?
3. What roles did Deborah have in Judges 4?
4. What happened as a result of Deborah's obedience?

Interpretation questions

1. How does Rahab's story challenge the idea that your past defines your future?
2. Why is it significant that God responded to Rahab's faith instead of her past?
3. What does Deborah's leadership reveal about how God uses people?
4. Why does proximity to God impact confidence and decision-making?

HER SUNDAY STUDY GUIDE

Application questions

1. What “label” or past failure have you allowed to shrink your prayers or dreams? How could focusing on God’s character instead change your requests?
2. Rahab’s faith led her to act even when it was risky. What step of courage—big or small—could you take this week to align your actions with what you believe about God?
3. The sermon emphasizes that “faith grows from what is heard.” Who in your life needs to hear a story of God’s faithfulness from you? How could sharing it strengthen their faith (or yours)?
4. Where are you currently waiting for permission instead of walking in obedience?
5. What would it look like for you to grow in proximity to God this week?
6. Are there competing voices in your life? How can you better recognize God’s voice?
